# *Sermon Discussion Questions*

## *What Could Paul Possibly Mean? 1 Timothy 2: 8 - 15*

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1. Try to come up with a list of passages that have made you feel uncomfortable when you have read them.
  2. When you come to a passage like this, what makes it “difficult”? Do you ever feel the desire to apologize for something in the Bible or hide it from a new believer or unbeliever?
  3. Why is it important that men are at peace when they pray (v8)?
  4. What does it mean to dress modestly (v9)? What part of this passage is timeless and what part is culturally situated? For example, can women braid their hair? Compare with 1 Peter 3:3-4.
  5. How might other passages help us interpret v11-12? Consider: Women accompanied Jesus and 12 disciples to proclaim the kingdom of God (Luk 8:1-3). Jesus chose women to be the first witnesses to the resurrection (Mt 28:5-10). Luke records the conversion of women. In Acts, they are engaged in corporate prayer (Acts 1:12-14). Priscilla teams with her husband teaching Apollos (Acts 18:26). Paul refers to women as workers in the Lord (Rom 16:12). Phoebe in Romans is singled out for her work with Paul (Rom 16). Women pray and prophecy in the setting of a public gathering (1 Cor 11:5; 14:26).
  6. Women are commanded to submit. Who are they not to submit to? Who should they submit to?
  7. Women are commanded not to teach men. So - which men must not be taught?
  8. What is the authority they are not to exercise over a man?
  9. What would you say to a person who says these verses are sexist?
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
