Sermon Discussion Questions

1 Timothy 3:8-13, The Servants of the Church

1. Discuss how you have seen churches organize deacons. Have they essentially been: elders, committees, individuals?
 2. Discuss the following ideas: Elders lead a ministry, deacons facilitate ministry, the congregation does ministry.
 3. What is the difference between an elder and a deacon? Compare 1 Timothy 3:1-7/3:8-13.
 4. Why do you think there are no recognized deacons in our church?
 5. What is the job description of a deacon? Read Acts 6 as a prototype for future deacon work.
 6. Does it seem selfish of the leaders of Jerusalem in Acts 6 to say they could not take care of the practical needs of the church? Shouldn't they be willing to serve?
 7. Discuss each qualification of 1 Timothy 3:8-13. From the qualifications try to write a job description of a deacon.
 8. Why is having some level of organized leadership (elders, deacons, etc.) important for a church? What is the ultimate purpose of these roles in a church?
 9. One author breaks the deacon role into three parts based on Acts 6: 1) Spot and Serve Tangible Needs 2) Promote Church Unity 3) Serve and Support the Ministry of the Elders. How could that work specifically in our church?
 10. What are the promises to deacons in 1 Timothy 3:13? What is the purpose of mentioning them and should these promises motivate?
